
Memogate Lineup



The Senate Sergeant-at-Arms is currently holding more than 4,760 memos detailing strategies on judicial confirmations and believed to highlight ethical, and possibly criminal, wrongdoing by Democratic members of the Senate Judiciary Committee. In fact, one former Senate aide who's viewed some of the memos and has filed a complaint with the Senate Ethics Committee states:

"I recall seeing memos that indicate that the vote for at least one nominee was being influenced by the promise of campaign funding and election support..."

In one memo to Senator Kennedy, two of his aides recommend at least one nominee to the 6th Circuit be delayed in order to influence the outcome of a high-profile, pending case.

Yet, Committee members, *Democrats and Republicans alike*, continue to ignore the content of these memos, calling *only* for investigations into how they were obtained.
